When Jackie Meggs celebrated her 30th birthday, she looked around the room at her loved ones and was overcome with emotion. Earlier that year, they almost lost her in a horrible accident. In the days, weeks, and months that followed, they supported Jackie through the hardest year of her life.



lackie is a Big Island resident, high school math teacher, and traumatic brain injury

(TBI) survivor. In January 2021, lackie went on a solo hike and fell, about 30 feet, down the side of a switchback. Jackie nearly lost her life from the fall and suffered from severe injuries. Bystanders called for help and she was rushed to Oahu where she received emergency care and underwent multiple surgeries. When Jackie arrived as an inpatient at REHAB Hospital of the Pacific, she couldn't move more than half of her body.

In REHAB's traumatic brain injury rehabilitation program, Jackie had a path forward with a full schedule of intensive daily therapy, which included physical, occupational, and speech therapy. She experienced many recovery breakthroughs during lackie explains the importance her 6 week long stay at REHAB, including regaining use of her left hand, relearning how to write, and walking again for the first time. At times it was hard to stay positive, but Jackie says the staff supported her recovery with "an incredible amount of gentle patience."

However, Jackie's journey through recovery didn't end when she was discharged from REHAB Hospital, she needed to continue her therapy through REHAB's outpatient services. Despite the huge challenges she had already overcome during her inpatient stay, Jackie still had difficulty changing directions while walking and struggled trying to multitask-even talking while walking was a feat.

Both inpatient and outpatient REHAB played important roles in lackie's overall recovery journey. of each, saying, "Inpatient got me to a level where I was a normal functioning human in society and I could do daily tasks. Outpatient got me to a level where I was actually confident going back to work."

lackie worked hard for her recovery. Today, she is able to walk, swim, and run nearly two miles. She is back to teaching and says her students have been her biggest cheerleaders. When lackie first returned to teaching, she chose lemon decor as her classroom theme. It's a symbol of the outlook that helped her through the tough times. "A positive mindset is truly a force to be reckoned with," she says. "I now believe that when life gives you lemons, you must make lemonade."



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#### iCare Cancer Exercise Rehabilitation Study

"The common assumption is once you are cancer free, your life goes back to normal. But cancer treatments can take a significant toll on day-to-day life..." says REHAB iCare participant, Lynn Taguma, who knows this well. Lynn recalls, "I was scared and frustrated because I could not walk very far and was easily fatigued."

Lynn was determined to regain her health and joined REHAB's iCare program, a program available to adults that have been diagnosed and treated for any type of cancer. As a result, Lynn progressed from having trouble walking down a hallway to walking around a city block.

## "Not only did iCare help in my recovery, but it gave me the opportunity to make an impact too."

iCare patients like Lynn make important contributions to advancing rehabilitation education and cancer research here in Hawaii. The iCare Program is a collaborative study between REHAB and the University of Hawaii. Working together with the UH Kinesiology and Rehabilitation Science Department, REHAB studies how cancer rehabilitation exercise diminishes the toxic and long-term effects associated with cancer therapies.

Lynn takes pride in her role in advancing cancer research. She says, "As an iCare participant, the results from my time at REHAB will go towards helping other cancer survivors with their own recovery journeys. That thought touches my heart knowing that it took research and volunteers who came before me, to create the treatments that made my recovery possible."

#### **REHAB Preceptorship Program**

Lynn's participation in iCare research isn't her only contribution to future patients. During her iCare sessions, she partnered with students in training to become healthcare professionals. By providing therapy for patients like Lynn, students apply the hands-on skills they've learned in the classroom. These aspiring healthcare professionals are a part of REHAB's Preceptorship Program.

REHAB's Preceptorship Program helps address the critical shortage of healthcare workers across Hawaii. The Preceptorship Program offers students from our partnering universities and colleges an experiential pipeline for healthcare professions ranging from Registered Nurses to Speech Therapists. Special mahalo to The Mamoru and Aiko Takitani Foundation, Inc., who has provided support for this program over the last several years.

REHAB's iCare is part of this program with the goal of expanding the number of Certified Clinical Cancer Specialists on Oahu.
